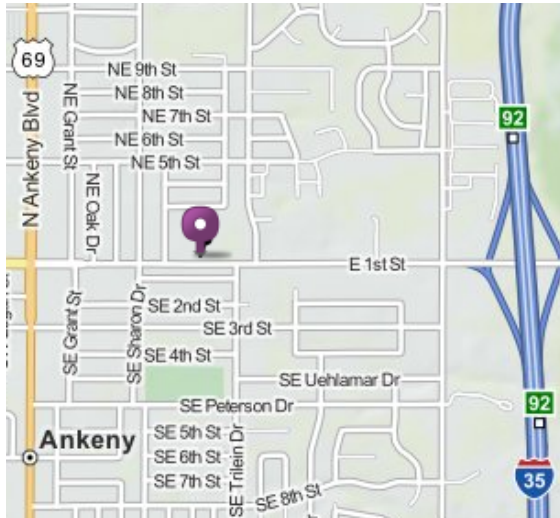

**MAY WE INTRODUCE OURSELVES?** For nearly 30 years, the members of Central Iowa Fly Fishers (CIFF) have fished the lakes, rivers, and streams of Iowa and beyond. Iowa entertains fly fishers with over 150 miles of cold water streams containing several species of trout, in addition to hundreds of lakes and ponds harboring panfish and bass. But CIFF members don't limit their fishing to Iowa waters. They enjoy reeling in all kinds of fish from all kinds of water: bluegill and bass in warm water lakes and ponds; trout, steelhead, and salmon in cold water streams; and even sharks and bonefish in salt water oceans.



## THERE'S MORE...

In addition to fishing, many members engage in flycasting instruction, fly tying, fly rod construction, and conservation efforts. CIFF members are generous in sharing their knowledge and expertise with other anglers. Club outings and clinics provide opportunities for new anglers to learn fly casting and fly tying from experienced members.

During the annual Cabin Fever Retreat, CIFF members spend a January weekend at Springbrook State Park listening to member and park service presentations, swapping fish stories, tying flies, readying equipment for the spring fishing season, and enjoying good food and each others' company.
